
There are several actions we need you to complete immediately, **no later than May 10, 2020** to expedite the transmission of funds to you.

- 1) Ensure that the mailing address we have for you is accurate. If we need to mail you a check it will be important that we have your current address. Do so by logging in at [MyHeritage](#) and editing your profile if in fact it is not current.
- 2) The surest and most expedient method of sending you your stimulus money is by direct deposit into your bank account. If you have a bank account into which we can deposit the money directly, simply complete the secure form linked [here](#) using your Heritage University e-mail address and password. This will enable us to deposit money quickly and easily.
