The figures shown above are for standard two semesters only (fall semester $=16$ weeks, spring semester $=16$ weeks). Undergraduate budgets are based on full-time tuition, 12-18 credits per semester, less than full-time credits or additional credits are charged at $\$ 830 / \mathrm{cr}$., and graduate (master's) budgets are based on 6 credits per semester at $\$ 835 /$ cr. Summer 2022 budget expenses (not shown here) will be based on 8 weeks of attendance.

Undergraduate enrollment status per semester is:
12-18 credits per semester $=$ full-time undergraduate status
$9-11$ credits per semester $=3 / 4$-time undergraduate status
$6-8$ credits per semester $=1 / 2$-time undergraduate status
5 credits and below $=$ less than $1 / 2$-time status
Graduate enrollment status per semester is:
6 or more credits per semester are equal to full-time graduate status.
4 or 5 credits per semester are equal to $3 / 4$-time graduate status.
2 or 3 credits per semester are equal to $1 / 2$-time graduate status.

## Other allowable expenses, not included in the table above:

Child care/dependent care may be added. Childcare allowance can be increased if student submits documentation of actual expenses, and/or has more than one child requiring care thus increasing the expense. These allowances are restricted to costs directly resulting from the student's attendance at the University.

Commuting Expense may be considered for out-of-area commuting to attend classes for standard institutional mileage rates. To qualify, you live more than 22 miles from campus.

## Please take the time to look at your expenses!

The actual cost of attendance is unique for each student. While some expenses are fixed (such as tuition and fees), others are influenced by lifestyle and personal choices and are thus controlled by the individual. The purpose of financial aid is to assist you with costs directly related to your education, therefore we cannot consider personal choice expenses such as car payment, credit card debt, gifts for family members, holiday expenses, etc. In considering the reality of being a University student and examining the expense involved, you should first evaluate the reasonableness of your own expenses compared with what you may receive in funding from the school. We hope you will use this worksheet as a tool for establishing a budget to make sure you are living within your means while you are a student.
